### **Institutional Authorization**

Western Governors University is authorized to provide its educational programs in South Carolina through a state authorization reciprocity agreement (NC-SARA). More information about NC-SARA is available on their website.

### **Licensure Pathway**

<sup>\*</sup>Advanced programs are for already licensed teachers who want to add an additional teaching area or field to their licenses (or a separate license for Educational Leadership). These programs are not intended for aspiring teachers seeking initial licensure.

The following advanced programs do not meet all of the educational prerequisites for licensure in South Carolina.

- MA Mathematics Education (Middle Grades)\*
- MA Mathematics Education (Secondary)\*
- MA Science Education (Middle Grades)\*

South Carolina requires three courses for middle grades certification, which WGU's advanced programs do not include. Candidates will need to complete these courses at a South Carolina institution in order to be eligible for middle grades certification. To add a secondary mathematics endorsement, South Carolina requires 26 hours of mathematics content coursework. WGU's program does not include all 26 hours. Candidates must have already completed some coursework at previous institutions or plan to complete additional coursework outside of WGU.
