Areas of Impact

The Leavitt School of Health is a Designated Center of Excellence in Nursing Education by the National League for Nursing. Only 1% of nursing programs across the U.S. earn this designation.



In the 2022-23 academic year, the Leavitt School of Health conferred 5.4% of all bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing across the country. In 2021 alone, it produced 17% of the nation's registered nurses earning a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

The \$100 million Reinvesting in Nursing Education and Workforce (ReNEW) Fund helps aspiring nurses with financial barriers by covering the final two years of WGU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Prelicensure) program, including labs and clinical placements.
