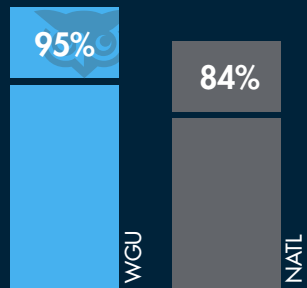


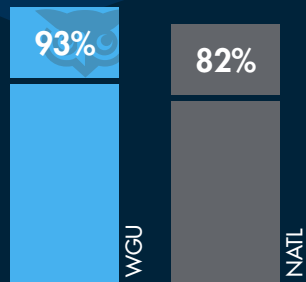
National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE)

This survey is conducted annually and asks undergraduate students about the quality and characteristics of their higher education experience. The 2021 survey collected responses from 211,667 students at 342 institutions—337 in the U.S. and five in Canada.

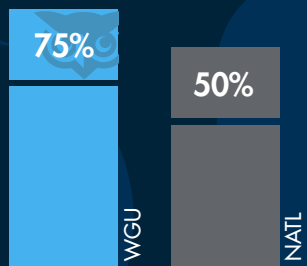

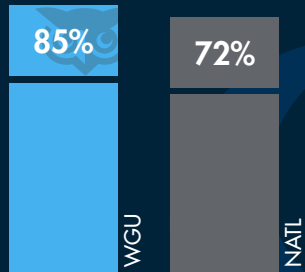
If you could start again, would you go to the same institution?
(“Probably Yes” and “Definitely Yes”)



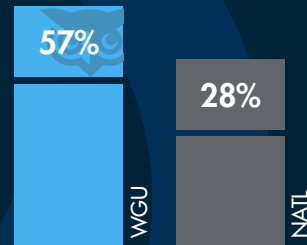
How would you evaluate your entire educational experience at this institution?
(“Good” and “Excellent”)



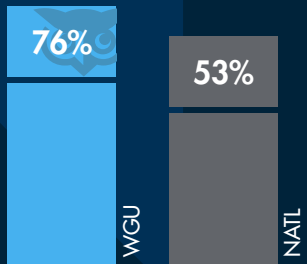
Indicate the quality of your interactions with the faculty at your institution.
(6 and 7 on a scale of 1-7)



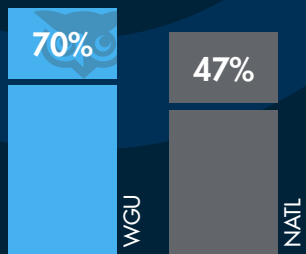
How much does your institution emphasize providing support to help students succeed academically?
