Institutional Authorization

Western Governors University is authorized to provide its educational programs in Texas through a state authorization reciprocity agreement (NC-SARA). More information about NC-SARA is available on their website.

Licensure Pathway

Candidates applying for a teaching license in Texas will use either the out-of-state licensure pathway or the direct licensure pathway, depending on their program. Information on the different licensure pathways is available in the <u>licensure handbook</u>. Educational Prerequisites

WGU's education preparation programs satisfy the applicable educational prerequisites for initial professional licensure in Utah. Once a candidate has obtained their Utah license, the candidate applies for initial licensure in Texas as an out-of-state certified educator through a Review of Credentials. Texas Education Agency (TEA) will likely require initial licensure candidates to pass TEALearn's free dyslexia course and additional content and professional tests.
